Miller, Miller, Miller & Sloan were three brothers and a friend (Sloan) who put together perfect pieces of white funk and rap during the eighties in New York. They went as far as playing at CBGB and opening for The Clash and Tom Tom Club. They had plenty of big-name fans. So why did they never get a hit? This is the meaty story of four white boys from Manhattan's Upper West Side who played black rhythms at the height of the new wave explosion. Before the Beastie Boys and the Red Hot Chili Peppers.

The interviews in this documentary reveal them as intelligent, funny, humble musicians who are able to laugh at their lack of professional direction and their unfair irrelevance in the history of pop.
